SPECIES & BARN SPECIFIC RULES FOR 4-H BEEF

- 1. Late Registrations will not be accepted unless arrangements have been made with the office
- 2. Exhibitors must abide by the Department of Agriculture's rules and regulations and the General Livestock rules which is found at the beginning of the Premium Book.
- 3. Cattle will have a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI) completed within 30 days of check-in.
- 4. Animals are assigned a Check-In time in which;
 - ♦ All exhibitors are responsible for getting their animals onto the scale during the check-in process.
 - ♦ Health papers and animals will be checked, and regulations will be enforced.
- 5. Cattle shall be identified by an official ear tag or other unique identification device approved by the PDA official identification includes;
 - ♦ A USDA-issued National Uniform Ear tagging system (This is the last year that a NUES tag will be accepted) or
 - ♦ A 15 digit Animal Identification Number (AIN) ear tag starting with "840"
- 6. All Grooming And Fitting (Bath/Brush/Blow) Must Occur In The Beef Barn No Exceptions.
- 7. Due to space limitations and safety concerns, use of grooming chutes in the Beef Barn are subjected to the following regulations:
 - Grooming Chutes may be brought into the Beef Barn after Fair Closing on Monday evening and must be removed immediately following judging on Wednesday.
 - ♦ Grooming Chutes may also be used for special events i.e. fitting competitions.
 - ♦ To ensure equal access to the washing facilities, grooming chutes are NOT PERMITTED on the wash rack.
- 8. Exhibitors must keep their animals under control at all times.

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9. Each exhibitor may enter 2 Steers, 2 Veal Calves, and 2 Dairy Beef. All animals may be sold during the Youth Livestock Sale. Grand Champion and Reserve Grand Champion animals MUST be sold at the Youth Livestock Sale.

- 10. Stall decorations must remain on display and maintained until the animals leave the grounds.
- 11. All stalls will be assigned by the Superintendent.
- 12. Any/all issues must be brought to the Superintendent. If the Superintendent is unable to resolve the issue it will be taken before the Board of Directors for resolution.
- 13. It is recommended that youth exhibitors use a show stick and show halter with a chain during judging.

14. IMPORTANT SALE INFORMATION

- Market animals may be sold during the Youth Livestock Sale. Grand Champion and Reserve Grand Champion animals MUST be sold at the sale.
- Exhibitors MUST be on time and present in the sale ring when their animal is scheduled for sale. Those that are not, will be sold through the Buy-back program.
- Exhibitors MUST take the sale paperwork to their buyer for signature to complete the transaction. Families MUST have a parent/sibling/friend present at ringside to hold the animal while this is done.
- Exhibitors MUST care for their market animals through load out on Saturday afternoon. This includes proper feed/water, pen maintenance and washing any fitting products off the animals.
- All exhibitors are responsible for leading their animals onto to the buyers truck.
- ♦ The PA Beef Council will deduct an additional \$1 per head for all animals sold at the Youth Livestock Auction

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Section 304 - VEAL

- 1. The project animal must be born between May 1, 2025 and July 1, 2025.
- 2. All calves should be fed the Special Veal High Fat Milk Replacer or Whole Milk ONLY.
- 3. NO GRASS, HAY OR GRAIN
- 4. All veal calves must be of a Dairy Breed, NOT a Beef Dairy Cross.
- 5. The minimum weight is 180 pounds. There is no maximum weight limit.
- 6. Animals must be clean, with the head, tail and underbelly clipped.

Section 305 - DAIRY BEEF

- 1. Dairy Beef must be 100% Red & White or Black & White Holstein Steer. The Signature of the Holstein Breeder is required on the Registration Form or attach a Signed Sales Receipt to the Registration Form.
- 2. Dairy Beef must be a Steer not a Heifer.
- 3. Steer must be castrated by June 1st of current year
- 4. Steer must be dehorned and healed.
- 5. Steers Head, Tail and Underbelly must be clipped (approximately 1 week before fair).
- 6. The Grand and Reserve Grand Champion must be sold through the Youth Livestock Sale.
- 7. Vaccination Requirements:
 - Dairy Cattle must include a Health Certificate, signed by an accredited veterinarian that includes a statement that the animal(s) identified have been immunized against IBR, PI3, and BVD.
 - Animals that have never been vaccinated against BVD or have not been vaccinated against BVD during the previous 12 months, must receive one dose of modified live virus vaccine given at least 21 days, and not more than 180 days before the show, or two doses of killed vaccine, two to four weeks apart, with the last dose given at least 15 days and not more than 180 days before the show.
 - Animals that have been vaccinated against BVD within the previous 12 months must receive at least a single injection of modified live virus or killed vaccine given not less than 15 days and not more than 180 days before the show.
 - ♦ IMPORTANT! The date of the last live virus vaccination, or the dates of the last two killed virus vaccinations must be recorded on the Health Certificate.
 - Hyper Immune Serum may not be used as a substitute for the above vaccination requirement. No Animal will be admitted to the American Legion County Fairgrounds unless these requirements have been met.
